
## King Abdulaziz and his Companions Foundation for Giftedness and Creativity (Mawhiba)

Mawhiba's mission is to provide an inspirational environment for giftedness and creativity, and to promote passion for science and knowledge in the development of future leaders. Mawhiba focuses on nurturing and fostering gifted students through a variety of programs and services starting with the National Project for Gifted Identification to college preparation and career guidance programs. All to achieve Mawhiba's vision to enable giftedness and creativity as the main contributions to the advancement of humanity.



## King Abdulaziz and his Companions Foundation for Giftedness and Creativity (Mawhiba)

King Abdulaziz and his Companions Foundation for Giftedness & Creativity (known as "Mawhiba") was established in 1999 as a non-profit foundation to support the long term vision of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) for developing giftedness and creativity in KSA.

Mawhiba's mission is to provide an inspirational environment for giftedness and creativity, and promote passion for science and knowledge in the development of future leaders. The foundation has a vison to enable giftedness and creativity as the main contributions to the advancement of humanity.

The main gate way for identification is through **the National Project for Gifted Identification.** The project runs Mawhiba Multiple Cognitive Aptitude Test (MMCAT) that was developed, in 2011, by Mawhiba in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and the National Center for Assessment. The test is administered to ensure sound, fair and unbiased selection process for the students. It is conducted annually in English and in Arabic for students in grades 3, 4, 6, and 9 in more than 100 centers all over the kingdom. Since 2011, more than 100,000 students were identified as gifted students.

Selected students, from the 4th to 12th grade, are offered to Join Mawhiba Gifted

Classes; a high-quality educational environment for gifted students to help them reach their full

potential by providing additional curricula. Mawhiba supports the selected schools by providing

continuous professional development, regular assessments, annual tests, as well as conducting

parent orientation workshops, in addition to the Afterschool STEM programs targeting children

in grades 4-9. Students are also offered to join Mawhiba Enrichment Summer Programs

(MESPs) as informal education including residential and commuting summer programs that are

either local or international in the world's top universities. Through MSEPs, Mawhiba invites

international institutes to partner with local institutes to deliver world class programs to ensure a high-quality know-how transferred to local partners.

More gifted students are identified through the National Olympiad for Scientific

Creativity "Ibda'a". It is the Kingdom's largest science competition organized by Mawhiba in collaboration with the Ministry of Education that targets students in grades (7-12) to help them develop their research skills and encourages learning and self-development through science fairs. Finalists are then selected to participate in Intel ISEF. Since 2007, Mawhiba students obtained 43 grand awards and 23 special awards in total. Mawhiba students also participate in the Science International Olympiads in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Science, Biology, and Information Technology. They go through a series of training camps where they receive more than 2500 hours of training. Since 2010, Mawhiba students have won a total of (232) medals in these Olympiads.

More services are offered to gifted students such as **counseling**, **college preparation**, and **Career Guidance**. Mawhiba also organizes a variety of programs to raise awareness about Giftedness and creativity by conducting workshops, scientific forums, and various events, in additions to translating books, papers and articles to be available to all educators and practitioners.

In terms of strategic partnerships, Mawhiba has significant partnerships with local and international key gifted education entities. It is looking forward to extend such collaborations to develop gifted programs and services. The foundation is also enhancing its international collaborations by participating in activities such as research on latest trends and practices in gifted education, and participating and hosting educational conferences. All to enable the gifted who are the most important contributors to the world.
